



About Student Exchange

If your home institution is a partner institution and has an exchange agreement with Ara, you can study at Ara and pay tuition fees to your home institution. Depending on the agreement in place, there may be other costs you will need budget for such as accommodation and textbooks.

Nomination

You will be nominated to be considered for the Student Exchange Programme by your institution's Exchange Coordinator. Eligible degree level students choose to do either one or two semesters at Ara.

Depending on the agreement in place your study may be credited to your degree in your home country.

Accommodation

A variety of accommodation options include:

- staying with a host family (homestay)
- designated student hostels
- · apartments or student flats.

About Study Abroad

If your home institution does not have an exchange agreement with Ara but is a partner institution you can study at Ara as a Study Abroad student for one or two semesters.

You will pay your tuition fees directly to Ara. As a Study Aboard student from a partner institution there may be partial fee scholarships available to you.

Personal Development



Application process

Download and complete the Ara application for study abroad/exchange form from

ara.ac.nz/international-enrolment-form

- a copy of your academic transcript (in English)
- · a Proof of English proficiency, if required
- details of any relevant work experience
- personal statement, telling us why you want to study this course and what you hope to achieve from this exchange experience
- letter of recommendation from your home institution.



Fees and deadlines

We are always happy to receive early applications.

Applications for Semester 1 (Feb-June) should be received by 1 November.

Applications for Semester 2 (July - November) should be received by 1 May.

Late applications may be considered.

We have regular English language courses starting throughout the year, so applications on an ongoing basis are welcomed.

Code of Practice requirements

Eligibility for health services

Most international students are not entitled to publicly funded health services while in New Zealand. If you receive medical treatment during your visit, you may be liable for the full costs of that treatment.
