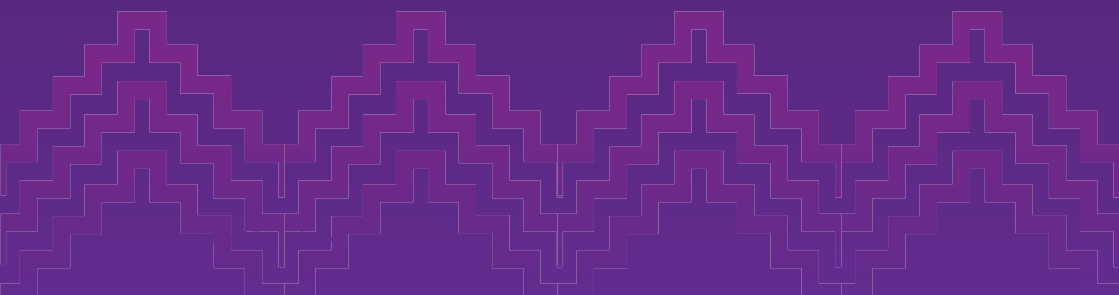

**Are you still at school but ready
to step into your future?**

An Ara Dual Enrolment programme is a fantastic way to explore career options, gain real skills and earn NCEA credits, all while still enrolled at school.

Whether you're into cookery, health, hair and beauty, trades, business or something else, a Dual Enrolment programme lets you try out a career path while getting a feel for tertiary study. You'll attend Ara one or two days a week and spend the rest of the time doing your regular schoolwork with your friends.



How dual enrolment works

- On a Dual Enrolment programme, you're enrolled at school and Ara at the same time
- You study at Ara for 1-2 days a week (similar to school hours) and the rest of the week at school
- You have the same holidays as your school
- You gain NCEA credits and industry skills
- You have access to support services at your school and at Ara
- When you finish your Dual Enrolment programme, you'll be better prepared for further study, an apprenticeship or employment

Key benefits:

- You gain practical skills in a field you're actually interested in
- You get a taste of the real world beyond the classroom
- You build your confidence and gain independence
- You stay on track with school while getting ahead for the future
- You make friends and connections outside of your school bubble

Why parents/guardians love Dual Enrolment:

- You continue to work towards NCEA
- You gain practical experience in a safe, supported environment
- It helps you to make informed decisions about future study or work
- It gives you a strong pathway into tertiary education or employment

Important things to know

- Dual Enrolment is free (but depends on eligibility)
- Spaces are limited so it's important to apply early
- Some programmes have small additional costs (like materials, uniform)
- Programmes require a minimum number of people to run
- Some programmes have limited spaces due to workshop or classroom capacity

Who can apply

- You must be 15 years or older at the start of the calendar year
- You must be enrolled in Year 11, 12 or 13
- If you're an international student, you must have Domestic Student Status on your visa

If you meet these criteria, talk to your parents/guardian and your school careers advisor to choose the pathway that best fits your interests.

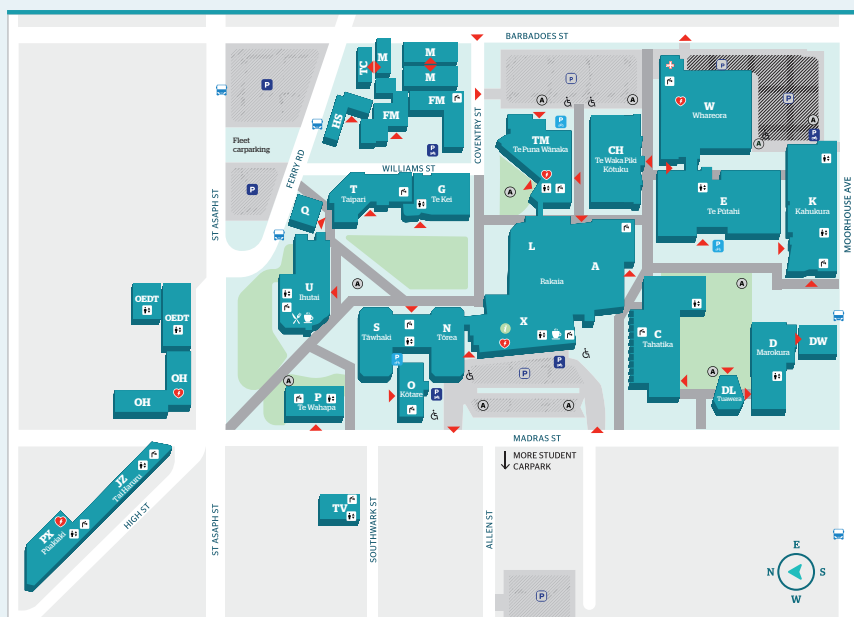

Campus information

City campus, Christchurch

City campus is our biggest campus. It's where the largest number of study options are taught and where you can access a comprehensive range of student services. City campus is located on the edge of Christchurch's central business district, close to public transport and many other amenities.



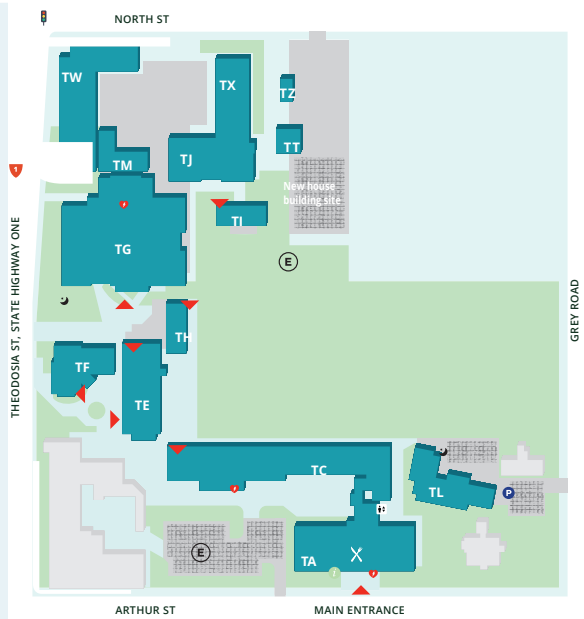
Woolston campus, Christchurch

The Woolston campus is dedicated to trades training. It has extensive facilities for construction, automotive and engineering-related trades, including industry-standard equipment and real-world learning spaces. It's located in eastern Christchurch and has good transport links and parking on site.



Timaru campus

Our Timaru campus is located just a short stroll from the city's central business district and features modern facilities and a range of services for students.



FAQs

How do I apply?

Make an appointment to talk to your careers advisor at school about applying for one of our courses – they'll guide you through it step by step.

How do I get selected?

Make sure your application is fully completed, with all sections filled in accurately. Applications are assessed using a selection rubric to generate a final score. Placements are then offered based on these scores. Please note: Some programmes have limited spaces, so submitting an application does not guarantee acceptance.

Is there an age restriction?

You must be aged 15 or over at the start of the calendar year, be enrolled in a secondary school, and be in Year 11, 12 or 13. If you're turning 15 between January and March, contact Ara to discuss possible options.

Are there any other entry requirements?

To be considered for a Dual Enrolment course at Ara, you will need to have:

- a genuine interest in your programme of choice
- a record of regular school attendance
- a record of consistent and responsible behaviour at school
- a demonstration of maturity to study within a tertiary environment and the ability to manage the associated workload

How will I get to Ara?

Depending on your location, you may

be eligible for travel assistance. Talk to your careers advisor if this applies to you.

What should I wear?

You need to wear suitable clothing and footwear for your course – we'll provide more information on your first day. Please note: Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) will be provided for selected programmes.

What can I expect from my Dual Enrolment programme?

- A hands-on learning experience
- A mix of theory, practical and self-directed learning
- Literacy and numeracy skill development
- Access to state-of-the-art facilities and commercial spaces
- Relevant industry skills and experience

What is expected of me at Ara?

- Respectful, responsible and mature behaviour always



- 100% attendance to get the most out of your Ara experience
- Alcohol, smoking, vaping and drug use are forbidden
- You must remain on the Ara campus during course hours (you can't leave campus at lunchtime or during breaks)
- If you need to leave early, you must provide a letter signed by a parent/ caregiver or a school leave form
- Any serious attendance or behaviour issues will be addressed promptly and communicated to the relevant parties (serious misconduct may result in a discontinuation of enrolment)
- Personal protection equipment is compulsory for specific programmes due to health and safety regulations - you can't enter restricted areas without the correct PPE gear
